Types of bequests

We recommend that anyone wishing to recognise St Albans High School for Girls in their will seeks the advice of their solicitor and other financial advisors. The school is a registered charity and therefore any bequest will normally be free of inheritance tax, and could reduce the overall tax payable on your estate.

There are several ways to support St Albans High School for Girls in your will:

- **A pecuniary legacy:** a gift of a fixed sum of money or a percentage of your estate.
- **A residuary legacy:** leaving the full balance of your estate.
- **A specific legacy:** a gift of personal property, allowing you to leave specific assets such as real estate, works of art, stocks and shares, or other valuables.
- **A reversionary legacy:** a gift which allows you to leave assets to the school whilst giving a named person the benefit of these during his or her lifetime.





Recognition

Those who make legacy pledges to the school will be invited to become a member of The 1889 Society, which recognises and thanks those who have generously shown their support and commitment to the school through a gift in their will.

An annual event will be held for members of the Society, allowing them to revisit the school and meet current pupils. Membership will be discrete and, of course, anonymity will be respected if wished.
